


St Paul's Egham Hythe Zoom Christingle Service

Getting ready

Lighting the Advent Candles and gathering what we need

Song: Sing Christingle

The Christingle begins with an orange,

The orange (reminding us of the world)

In the beginning of creation when God made heaven and earth, the earth was without form and void. Darkness was over the face of the deep and a mighty wind swept over the waters. God said, 'Let there be light', and there was light.

All: God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from darkness.

The red band (reminding us of the sacrifice of Jesus)

We say sorry to God for turning away from his love)

Lord Jesus you are the Light of the World, but sometimes we hide from your light because it shows up the wrong things we do.

All: Father, forgive us

We're sorry that we don't always care for the world you have given us.

All: Father, forgive us

We're sorry that we can be selfish and don't want to share.

All: Father, forgive us

We're sorry that we don't always love our neighbours.

All: Father, forgive us

Absolution

May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Saviour cleanse you and forgive you your sins through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

The fruits (reminding us of all that God provides)

Reading: Galatians 5: 22-23

...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control.

The candle (reminding us of Jesus the light of the world)

Reading: Luke 11: 33-36

“No one after lighting a lamp puts it in a cellar, but on the lampstand so that those who enter may see the light. Your eye is the lamp of your body. If your eye is healthy, your whole body is full of light; but if it is not healthy, your body is full of darkness. Therefore consider whether the light in you is not darkness. If then your whole body is full of light, with no part of it in darkness, it will be as full of light as when a lamp gives you light with its rays.”

Song: Like a candle flame

Like a candle flame flickering small in our darkness,
