Readings for Sunday 12th September

First Reading: Job 38: 1-7 and 39: 1-8

38 Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind: ² "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? ³ Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. ⁵ Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? ⁶ On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone ⁷ when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?

39 "Do you know when the mountain goats give birth? Do you observe the calving of the deer? ² Can you number the months that they fulfill, and do you know the time when they give birth, ³ when they crouch to give birth to their offspring, and are delivered of their young? ⁴ Their young ones become strong, they grow up in the open; they go forth, and do not return to them. ⁵ "Who has let the wild ass go free? Who has loosed the bonds of the swift ass, ⁶ to which I have given the steppe for its home, the salt land for its dwelling place? ⁷ It scorns the tumult of the city; it does not hear the shouts of the driver. ⁸ It ranges the mountains as its pasture, and it searches after every green thing.

Second Reading: Mark 12: 28-31

²⁸ One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" ²⁹ Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; ³⁰ you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these.

For parents and carers with babies and pre-school children.






