#### **A note on membership of the PCC**

The PCC membership includes the following: All clergy licensed to the parish, the churchwardens, members of Deanery and Diocesan Synod and up to 9 lay members (elected for a three-year term, ideally spread out so a third is elected each year). Where this has become uneven, the PCC may draw lots at the first meeting to determine the length of service. Please note that PCC members are trustees of the charity and must comply with the regulations including an enhanced DBS check (the form is available on our website). PCC members are also required to complete the Foundation level Safeguarding Training every three years. This can be completed online, and it is expected that new members put this in place by the first full PCC meeting.
